4.A. 328-2023 City Council Meeting Minutes

Approved the minutes from the August 15, 2023 Regular Meeting of the City Council.

4.B. 296-2023 Water Meter Equipment Replacement

Authorized the Utilities Director to execute a contract in an amount not to exceed \$220,000 with Badger Meter, Inc., for the purchase of water service meters and associated items for use in the municipal water distribution system, determined that the contract is for a specialty item pursuant to NMC Section 2.91.050 as documented in Attachment 1 and determined this action was exempt from CEQA.

4.C. 312-2023 Corporation Yard Electrical Repair and Upgrades Project

Adopted Resolution R2023-092: (1) authorizing the Public Works Director to award a construction contract to, and execute a construction contract with, WestCal Design and Build, Inc., for the Corporation Yard Electrical Repair and Upgrades project in the bid amount of \$419,553; (2) authorizing the Public Works Director to approve change orders and charges for project services up to \$116,955 for a total project amount not to exceed \$536,508; and (3) determining that the actions authorized by this resolution are exempt from CEQA.

4.D. 318-2023 Grant Agreement with Abode Services for Three Tenancy Care Vehicles

Authorized the City Manager to execute a grant agreement with Abode Services in an amount not to exceed \$225,000 to fund Adobe's purchase of three vehicles to be used by Abode to provide Tenancy Care transportation for individuals that have exited unsheltered homelessness.

Dear City Council,

My deepest apologies for missing the public comment section of the City Council meeting today!

My comments are related to the curbside area at Shetler Ave, next to Phillips Magnet Elementary School, and in front of Shurtleff Park.

A new change was recently made to reserve curbside time specific to school children drop off/ pick up for the Phillips Magnet Elementary School on Shetler Ave, including the curb section directly in front of Shurtleff Park. This park is one of the few off-leash dog parks located in Napa and is frequently used by dog owners, myself included.

My concern is focused on ensuring safety for both the Phillips Magnet Elementary school children that are being dropped off/ picked up and companion animals that are exercised throughout the day at Shurtleff Park by their owners.

According to some statistics and research studies 30% of animal bites are to children age 12 and younger. Given this, I would like to strongly encourage reconsiderations for the curb section immediately located at the front side of Shurtleff park (which includes the entrance gate) to be repurposed back to general parking to minimize/eliminate the cross flow between children and companion animals.
