5.K. <u>357-2024</u> Capital Improvement Program; FY 2024-2025 Mid-Year Budget Adjustments for Various Projects

Modified the Capital Improvement Program (CIP) budgets by deobligating funds from completed/cancelled projects, and obligating necessary funds to active projects by taking the following actions:

(1) Adopted Resolution R2024-099 of the City Council of the City of Napa, State of California, (1) Deobligating \$45,000 General Fund Non-Recurring Funds from Browns Valley / Valley Glen (33ST19PW09); and (2) Deobligating \$205,000 Capital Improvement Program CIP General Reserve Funds From Browns Valley / Buhman Park (33ST19PW10); and (3) Obligating \$45,000 of General Fund Non-Recurring Funds to Restrooms, Alston Park (33PK18PR02); and (4) Obligating \$205,000 of Capital Improvement Program CIP General Reserve Funds for Restrooms, Alston Park (33PK18PR02); and thereby (5) Increasing the current expenditure budget of the Capital Improvement Fund by \$0, as documented in Budget Adjustment No. 27P4.

Adopted Resolution R2024-105 (1) authorizing the Public Works Director to negotiate with, award a construction contract to, and execute a construction contract with, ACCO Engineered Systems, Inc. for the Police HVAC Chiller Project (33FC20PW03) in the proposal amount of \$519,193.86; (2) authorizing the Public Works Director to approve change orders and charges for project services up to \$121,338.77 for a total project amount not to exceed \$640,532.63; (3) determining that the exceptions for procurement via existing contracts of other public agencies and for specialty items in Napa Municipal Code Sections 2.91.060 And 2.91.050 apply to the construction contract; And (4) obligating \$300,000 of Capital Improvement Program General Fund Facility funds for the Police HVAC Chiller Project (33FC20PW03); and thereby (5) adjusting the current expenditure budget of the Capital Improvement Fund by \$300,000 as documented in Budget Adjustment No. 11P4; and (6) determining that the actions authorized by this resolution are exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA guideline 15301.

Approved and authorized the Public Works Director to execute on behalf of the City Amendment No. 3 to Agreement No. C2022-543 with Syar Industries, Inc., for the purchase of asphalt and aggregate materials in the increased amount of \$750,000 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$6,054,000 and determine that the actions authorized by this item are exempt from CEQA.

5.P. <u>382-2024</u> Repair and Rehabilitation of 36-inch Water Main Crossing Redwood Creek

Adopted Resolution R2024-106 approving a budget transfer in the amount of \$150,000 from Water CIP Fund for the Repair and Rehabilitation of 36-inch Water Main Crossing Redwood Creek Project CIP Account 53160139-63WT24UTRR as documented in Budget Adjustment No. 64 and determine that the actions authorized by this resolution are exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guideline 15301.

6.A. <u>377-2024</u> Council Spotlight - Watershed Management

Deputy Utilities Director Joy Eldredge provided the report.

Farid Javandel, Sr. Traffic Engineer, and Lorien Clark, Sr. Transportation Planner, provided the report.

Mayor Sedgley called for public comment.

Maureen Trippe, Slow Down Napa - thanked City staff. Would like to see focus on a plan for traffic calming in residential neighborhoods.

Kara Vernor, Napa County Bicycle Coalition - thanked City staff for their partnership in making roads safer for bicyclists and pedestrians. Requested that we continue to make the bike network safer for all ages and abilities.

Cindy Deutsch, Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Commission member shared she was impressed with the progress made by City staff in the past year.

Tuesday Allison - President Napa Valley Taxi Coalition - shared there was a disconnect in collaboration with ride share and taxi companies.

Jim McNamara - provided comments regarding signage on Old Sonoma Road and concerns regarding drunk driving in the City.

Daniel Harder, Slow Down Napa - questioned progress on "no right turn on red" policy.

Discussion was turned back to Council. Individual comments and questions ensued.

Mayor called for a brief recess at 5:13 P.M. The meeting reconvened at 5:20 P.M.

6.C. <u>344-2024</u> Process to fill one upcoming Council Vacancy
