Mayor Sedgley and City Councilmembers read the proclamation. Jorge Gonzalez, President of the Napa County Hispanic Network, received the proclamation and provided remarks.

Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities Grants

Deputy City Manager Molly Rattigan provided the report.

Mayor Sedgley called for public comment.

Dave Whitmer representing Napa Housing Coalition - spoke in support of the item.

Nels DeLander, Field Representative for the Nor Cal Carpenters Union - asked that any future project include carpenter area standards: prevailing wage, health care, local hire, and use of skilled apprentices.

Steve Harris, Field Representative with Carpenters Local 751- also provided comments suggesting and supporting carpenter area standards for any future project.

Ryan O'Connell - provided comments in support of the item and also in support of the incorporation of carpenter area standards into any future project.

Discussion was turned over to Council. Brief individual comments and questions ensued.

A motion was made by Councilmember Luros, seconded by Councilmember Alessio, to adopt Resolution R2023-031 authorizing the City Manager or Deputy City Manager to submit an Affordable Housing and Sustainable Communities (AHSC) grant application to the State of California as co-applicant with Heritage Housing Partners for The Crescent project located at 2344 Old Sonoma Road in an amount not to exceed \$50 million for the construction of 65 low-income and 47 moderate-income deed restricted for-sale units and related sustainable transportation infrastructure and determining that the actions authorized by this resolution are exempt from CEQA. 5. COMMENTS BY COUNCIL OR CITY MANAGER:

Councilmember Alessio shared that, as serving as Chair to NVTA, she was invited to go to, and recently returned from, Washington D.C. to garner funds and support regarding transportation initiatives. She shared some takeaways from trip.

City Attorney Barrett reported that the City Council met in closed session on March 21, 2023, to discuss the potential initiation of litigation against manufacturers of opioids and pharmacies that dispense opioids. During that closed session, City Council authorized the City Attorney to enter into the 2022 national opioid settlement agreements with opioid manufacturers (Allergan and Teva) and three pharmacies that distribute opioids (Walgreens, Walmart and CVS). Mayor Sedgley, and Councilmembers Luros and Alessio voted to provide the authorization, with Vice Mayor Painter and Councilmember Narvaez absent from the closed session. He shared that the nature of the settlement was summarized in a webpage titled (nationalopioidsettlement.com) and copies of the settlement agreements are public records and available upon request to the City Clerk's Office.
