Having grown up in Napa (Napa High class of 1977), and then returning to Napa after I retired, I was struck by the remarkable changes in the downtown area. I now own two historic homes downtown, one which I rent out to long term renters, and one in which I live. I have gone through the process of renovating both to varying degrees and I am an avid supporter of the historic jewels we all enjoy in our beautiful old town neighborhoods. I would love to volunteer my analytical and team management skills to the city by serving on the Cultural Heritage Commission when an opening becomes available.

Additional Questions

What is your understanding of the role and responsibility of this board?

Based upon my observation of the Cultural Heritage Commission in action, I understand the time and thought each of the members must devote to the issues before them. Clearly, the discussion at the meetings is just a fraction of the work involved. Reading all of the materials and thinking about all of the competing interests and relevant laws and regulations before the meeting must take a great deal of time. I have a great deal of experience reading, thinking, and discussing complex issues. While I admittedly have no experience as a commission member, I can bring the skills needed to be a meaningful contributor. I have carefully read the municipal code sections outlining the responsibilities of the board and will not restate them here. Rather, I'll summarize by saying that my understanding is that the Commission both develops policy recommendations regarding the preservation of Napa's historic resources and translates past decisions into specific recommendations for action.

Have you ever attended a meeting of this board? If so, how many?

Yes. I have never had a matter before the board, but I have attended 2 meetings.

What duties of this board are most interesting to you?

I want to encourage homeowners and developers to embrace and celebrate the historic housing stock in the old town area, rather than view the requirements as an infringement on their ownership rights. Having said that, I understand the tension that can arise when rules are applied inflexibly or in a manner that prevents any viable economic use of a historic building. The balancing is complex. I am eager to help with that balancing process.

What activities of this board are least interesting to you?

I don't feel I fully understand the Commission's role in making recommendations regarding the Mills Act. It seems the role is very circumscribed. It is less interesting to me at this time but I suspect I may find it very interesting when I have a better understanding of the process.

What programs or projects would you like to see improved or implemented?

To encourage awareness of our historic buildings, including private residences, a reference resource for walking tours might be something the Commission could encourage. The materials could be both for tourists and residents. I've actually had a concierge from a local hotel come by my little house for a look as she was educating herself on architectural styles. There is clearly interest in our historic homes, both big and small. Napa Municipal Code Section 2.70.060.2 states that the Commission will "Make recommendations to encourage or facilitate the preservation of the city's historic resources, including programs for public information, educational and interpretive programs." I have not seen such programs, although I admittedly may have missed something. I'm a member of the Historical Society and have taken their tours but what if the Commission partnered with them for more fun educational projects? For instance, perhaps the Commission could help the Historical Society develop a "how to" resource to help owners of historic properties research the history of their home. I recently used some of the resources over at the Goodman Library to learn more about the history of my 1893 home. It was a walk through Napa history, with tanners and grocers, and even periods when the home sat vacant for years. It was fascinating and fun, but there are other aspects I did not pursue such as records help by the City of Napa. It would be great to pull together information on those various resources to advance appreciation of our historic properties.

How would you approach improving these project(s) or program(s)?

Historic homeowners are proud of their homes. I would reach out to the Liz Alessio (currently leading the Historical Society) to gauge interest in creating a resource on how to research the history of private homes. In additon, I would offer to research and prepare a first draft of the materials. I would shepard the draft through any approval processes. Once complete, I would then reach out to the Register as well as NextDoor to spread news of the resource. As part of that outreach, we could encourage people to pursue the research for their home, and then have an exhibit event in which people display a photo of their historic home and a summary of the history they have discovered. I think very low cost activities like this can really buid excitement for some of the beautiful little historic homes that are scattered around the city.

No, although I own two historic cottages in the old town area. i do not plan on any external renovations in the next coupld of years.
