After having served on the Commission for the past two years, I honestly cannot recall an activity or topic that was not interesting to me.

## What programs or projects would you like to see improved or implemented?

The following are a few examples of projects that I would like to see improved and implemented. Westwood Hills Park: I would like to build upon the recent improvements to Westwood Hills Park, focusing on trail maintenance and improvements to increase public safety and reduce erosion potential. As part of this effort, I would like to include vegetation management strategies aimed at reducing fire hazards through the removal of invasive plants (primarily Scotch broom) and replacement/restoration of native vegetation. Urban Landscapes and Parks: I would like to explore opportunities to incorporate more of an ecology philosophy to the way in which we landscape our urban landscapes and parks. The primary intent would be to improve aesthetics and biodiversity within these landscapes though the use of native trees and plants that could attract a wider range of insects and pollinators, which in turn would result in greater populations of birds among other ecological benefits. Not only could these areas create a more aesthetically pleasing areas for residents to picnic and interact, they could also provide for public education opportunities and function as outdoor classrooms, educating students on the value of native flora and fauna. Additionally, I believe there are opportunities to amend the Master Plan to place greater emphasis and importance on the benefits provided by our urban forests. Alston Park: I would like to enhance the tree planting and restoration efforts at Alston Park with particular focus on riparian areas and small drainages that have become gullies over the past several years.

Additionally, all prior Tree Commissoners have termed out. There are residents who attend each monthly commission meeting to share their concern about trees in our community. I see this as an area of opportunity for renewed focus. I would also like to see progress on previously approved master plan projects like Kennedy Park and Garfield Park.

How would you approach improving these project(s) or program(s)?

Many of the past Tree Commission efforts were related to rules and regulations regarding public/private property, historical trees, and making recommendations on types of trees for planting in neighborhood and right-of-way areas. I would like our commission to become more familiar with these items in the coming months. I strongly recommend that we move forward in developing an Urban Forestry Master Plan to demonstrate our city's commitment to trees. This year has been stalled due to COVID-19. There will be changes in the look and feel of the Commission and upcoming projects due to the retirement of John Coates, moving Parks & Recreation within Community Development, and fiscal constraints due to reduced city tax revenue. I worry about the impact this will have on newer initiatives, such as the Park Ranger program, which I believe was only initially approved for two years, as well as impacts to allocated funds for master plan phasing, and general maintenance and esthetics standards within our parks. The community rallied behind parks when lay-offs were discussed; they have been absolutely critical for our community's emotional and physical well-being during these challenging times. Our Parks, Trees & Recreation programs should be treasured not just in difficult times, but at all times.

During the past year, I served as a volunteer for the Napa County Resource Conservation District, working for the District's Vineyard Manager on vineyard irrigation and leaf stress issues. My knowledge of viticulture and agricultural practices gained from my coursework at Napa Valley College was especially helpful to me in understanding the goals of the Demonstration Vineyard (including the development of environmentally sound and water-saving practices). Throughout the 2020 growing season, I monitored soil moisture and leaf stress readings throughout the vineyard. I reported my observations to the Vineyard Manager, who used my data in determining irrigation levels in the vineyard. Beyond that, my many years of experience in land use issues and in acquisitions and sales for public projects qualifies me to serve on the Parks Commission. I was a public servant for 19 years before I retired from law practice in December 2019. Among many other land use and real property matters that I took on, I handled litigation for the County of Orange in which the County fought to retain rights to a large portion of O'Neill Regional Park. In that context, I dealt with many issues relating to parks and the preservation of regional recreational opportunities. Thus, through my experience as a public servant for 19 years, I developed an ability to balance competing interests in preserving public resources and parklands. Outside my public sector work, my community service experience has largely been in the area of volunteer political work. I was the City Captain in Tustin, California in 2004 for the local John Kerry presidential campaign, which required recruitment and supervision of the work of more than 20 precinct captains. I also traveled to Ft. Lauderdale, Florida during the week prior to the election to serve as a volunteer elections attorney and poll monitor for the national Kerry campaign. I also walked precincts in Florida to get out the vote. In 2008 and 2012, I served similarly for the Obama campaign. In 2008, I traveled to Toledo, Ohio during the week prior to the election, serving as both a poll monitor and precinct walker. In 2012, I performed precinct and get -out- the vote work for the Obama campaign in Las Vegas, Nevada.
