



### **Redistricting Criteria**

FAIR MAPS Act (California Elections Code Section 21621)


- Substantially equal size people, not citizens
- Contiguous districts should not hop/jump
- Maintain "communities of interest"
- Follow easily identifiable lines
- Keep districts compact appearance/function



### From COI to Maps

With more cities and counties using community based redistricting, we move redistricting out into the public, with maps driven by Community of Interest testimony.

- Input from community drives process with multiple ways for the public to engage.
- Rules for process emphasize the importance of traditional criteria and minimizing divisions of neighborhoods.
- Releasing maps for feedback today we will see plans to spark more public engagement.





## Community of Interest Forms

### Submitting Your COI Form

Input can be provided in public hearings or using the "Community of Interest Worksheet."



Community of Interest (COI) Worksheet

#### How to Document Your Community of Interest (COI)

- 1) What is the nature of the common social or economic interest of your community? You can describe what the common interests of your community are and why or how they are important.
- 2) Where is your community located? You can define it by neighborhood, streets, address, proximity to a key landmark (such as a school or community center), or other boundaries.
- 3) What are the geographic definers/boundaries of your neighborhood? Examples of definers/boundaries could be highways, roads, rivers, hills, or parks.







### What's Next
